

Château La Bastienne

Montagne Saint-Émilion

HISTORY

The Château La Bastienne, classified Premier Grand Cru Montagne in 1928, has been acquired Pierre-Emmanuel's grandfather in 1945. Located on the Southwest hillside of the plateau of Néac, close to Lalande-de-Pomerol, the vineyard benefits from an exceptional soil, marls with clayey-silty texture, gently sloping which assures a natural drainage. The marly grounds are the best of the Bordeaux area to get great red wines.

Fourth generation of vine-grower, Pierre-Emmanuel Janoueix took over the family vineyard in 2000, with for ambition to perpetuate the quality and to prove that Montagne-Saint-Emilion can also be a great wine.

So, on 17 ha of property, only 12,5 ha are planted. The yields were reduced by 15 to 20 %. The wine storehouse has totally been renewed and equipped in thermoregulation. Thanks to all these efforts, the wine of the Château La Bastienne, former Premier Grand Cru Montagne, became again a reference of Saint-Emilion.

THE TASTING

Ruby red color with purple reflections. Expressive nose with notes of black fruits and sweet spices.

Velvety mouth, caressed by creamy tannins. Lots of length.

Grape varieties: 100 % Merlot

Soil: clayey-silty marls with fossil oysters

Ageing: During 12 months in 1 to 3-wine-old barrels
